

Preparing for Changes

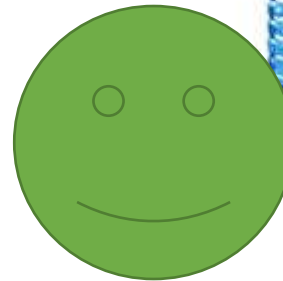


After the holidays there will be some new rules in school.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• No energy drinks• No hot drinks e.g. tea/coffee• No large sharing snacks e.g. sweets, chocolate bars, crisps	<p>Our brains work best without caffeine and with less sugar.</p> <p>Treats can be enjoyed outside of school.</p>	<p>Any items brought into school will be taken away and put in the bin.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• No jewellery• No long fake nails	<p>Our precious items can get lost or broken in school.</p> <p>Jewellery and nails can result in people getting hurt.</p> <p>They can be enjoyed and worn outside of school.</p>	<p>Any items brought or worn in school will be removed.</p> <p>Parents will need to collect.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• One toy per student.• Toys can be no larger than an A4 piece of paper.	<p>Having too many toys in school means they can get lost or broken.</p> <p>Too many toys take the focus off learning.</p> <p>Large toys take up too much learning space in our classrooms.</p>	<p>Any extra toys will be stored in a cupboard.</p> <p>Parents will be reminded of our one toy rule.</p>



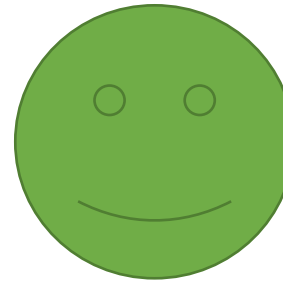
Plastic Bottles

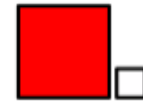

RULE	REASON	CONSEQUENCE
No Swearing	<p>Swearing is unkind.</p> <p>It upsets others.</p> <p>It shows poor sportsmanship.</p>	<p>You will receive ONE warning "NAME stop swearing, you have been warned."</p> <p>If you swear again AFTER your warning you will come off the pitch for 5 minutes.</p>
Football issues are dealt with during social times.	Students are coming into class and falling out over football instead of being ready to learn.	You will miss the next game of football (break or lunch).
End of play = back to class	We lose learning time.	You will miss the next game of football (break or lunch).
No hurting (including nasty/dirty/slide tackling)	<p>It is unkind.</p> <p>People get injured.</p> <p>It makes some children not want to join in.</p> <p>It shows poor sportsmanship.</p>	You will miss the next TWO games of football (break or lunch).
